Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas



Most elderly residents should probably cancel big Christmas celebrations for good measure. In case you missed it, things out there with COVID aren't looking so good, and it's increasingly clear that dinner parties and other intimate gatherings are playing a big part in the growing "second wave." Traveling to celebrate the season with other people, at a chilly time that's most conducive to indoor activities, seems less and less wise. And yet, a survey released in late October found that 61 percent of Americans who replied expected to spend Thanksgiving with people who don't live in their households; 90 percent planned to eat inside. Hopefully, some of these people will change their minds— if not, we seem to be in for a world of trouble since confirmed cases of COVID-19 in early November boomed up from 10 million to over 11 million in just a week's time. Currently, according

to the Center for Disease Control (CDC), Mississippi has nearly 156,868 cases of COVID-19 and up over 500 since last month there have been nearly 3,800 deaths. Of that, Coahoma County has 1270 cases with 43 deaths, while Quitman County has 500 cases and 7 deaths. Tallahatchie County has reported 981 cases with 27 deaths. However, as many families are making plans for December celebrations, federal health officials are hoping for mid-December vaccine approval. Unfortunately, distribution may not reach rural Mississippi until the spring. Thus, practicing stringent social distancing and staying home as much as possible should still be Plan A. There are many variations of social gathering rules in each state, but for some Americans, annual Christmas traditions are now out of the question due to updated travel guidelines in over 25 different states. Likewise, on December 1, 2020, Mississippi Gov. Tate Reeves announced that 54 of Mississippi's 82 counties (which include both Quitman and Coahoma counties) are now under additional COVID-19 requirements that mandatory masks inside schools, businesses or public spaces. In addition, the order restricts group gatherings to 10 people or less indoors and outdoors gatherings to 50 people if social distancing cannot be maintained. In the remaining counties, indoor gatherings are limited to 20 people and outdoor gatherings to 100 if social distancing cannot be maintained. In all counties, some gatherings are exempt, such as those at religious organizations or students meeting in classrooms. Previously, Reeves ordered bars and restaurants to serve alcohol only to seated patrons and not after 11 p.m. Most businesses must limit customers or visitors to 75 percent capacity and implement safety precautions. Visitors to nursing homes and other long-term care facilities should spend time with family members only and avoid contact with other residents, among other restrictions. While the idea of gathering the family may be hard to avoid, celebrating now holds a lot more anxiety than it ever did before because hosting a Christmas event will bring some form of risk to your home even if all of your guests abide by guidelines set forth by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the restrictions mandated by executive orders. Therefore, please consider having a smaller than usually Christmas so that we don't have a tragic new year as a result of unsafe holiday fun.

recipe gingerbread

1/2 cup white sugar
1/2 cup butter
1 egg
1 cup molasses
2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1 1/2 tsp baking soda
1 tsp cinnamon
1 tsp ground ginger
1/2 tsp ground cloves
1/2 tsp salt
1 cup hot water

Preheat oven to 350 F. Grease and flour a 9-inch square pan. In a large bowl, cream together the sugar and butter. Beat in the egg, and mix in the molasses. In a bowl, sift together the flour, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, ginger, and cloves. Blend into the creamed mixture. Stir in the hot water. Pour into the prepared pan. Bake 1 hour in the preheated oven, until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean. Allow to

cool in pan before serving.

Higher Utility Allowance Means Rent Lowered by \$1

Two major changes will affect the amount you pay for housing in the coming year. The first change is due to a raise in your utility allowance. Because rent calculations include the cost of both shelter and utilities, each year a utility analysis is conducted in order to assure that each resident's housing expenses be equal to no more than 30% of the household's adjusted monthly income. This year's calculation has resulted in an average raise of \$1 making one bedroom allowances \$58, studio apartment allowances \$41, and two-bedroom allowances \$73. The change became effective on November 17, 2020, and thus caused an average rent decrease of \$1. If you have not received a copy of this change to your lease prior

to making your December payment, a one-dollar credit will be notated on your rent receipt If you have not received a copy of your lease showing this decrease, please notify the leasing office. In addition, Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits will receive a Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) increase of 1.3 percent in 2020. Increased payments to SSI beneficiaries will begin on December 31, 2020 and the 1.3 percent cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) will begin for Social Security beneficiaries in January 2021. Social Security and SSI beneficiaries are normally notified by mail in early December about their new benefit amount. Most people who receive Social Security payments will be able to view their COLA notice online through their my Social Security online account at www.socialsecurity.gov/myaccount. Be mindful that rent is also determined by income. However, rent changes due to the COLA will not be in effected until your annual recertification.

IPM: Winter Pest Awareness


As the temperatures continue to drop, we aren't the only ones running into the warm indoors. Since colder weather does tend to push pest like rodents indoors, look for any openings behind kitchen cabinets and appliances, around your baseboards, and in closets. Notify management so that all cracks around your apartment can be sealed. Also, store food in airtight containers and **PEST CONTOL**

make sure to clean up any/all food spillage in your pantry. Be sure to clean away all pest dropping and do not leave open food containers in your pantry or even food in thin bags or containers – these will not stop a rodent! Poison packs should be placed behind each stove and refrigerator. If you see these packs torn or any pest evidence notify management immediately.

National Safety Council Safe Holiday Tips- Food Safety



- Keep raw meat away from fresh produce.
- Use separate cutting boards, plate and utensils for uncooked and cooked meats to avoid cross-contamination.
- Use a food thermometer to make sure meat is cooked to a safe temperature.
- Refrigerate hot or cold leftover food within two hours of being served.
- When storing turkey, cut the leftovers in small pieces so they will chill quickly.
- Thanksgiving leftovers are often only safe for 3-4 days if properly refrigerated.
